

Greater Phoenix Orienteering Club - Getting There is ALL the Fun!

Sept 24-25 at Thumb Butte (Prescott AZ)

Come join us for a weekend of camping and Orienteering in the cool pines near Prescott. Temperatures will be mild, with a typical day being clear with highs in the mid-70's and lows in the mid-40's. Primitive campsites are available in the general area of the start of the orienteering courses.

The terrain is mostly open Ponderosa pine forest, with occasional regions of thick brush. There has been logging activity and also controlled burns in the area since our last meet there in 2003. As a result, the map area for the courses has been shifted somewhat and necessitated a steeper terrain than is usually the case for orienteering courses. During the day, there will be a *challenging* Score-O course with an extended time limit of three hours. There will also be a White course for beginners. In the evening, there will be a shorter Night-O course with a mass start.

After the day's events, gather around the campfire for tall tales and camaraderie. There are primitive campsites (no water, power, or rest rooms) along FR 373 and FR 51. There is a logging camp along FR 51 which may limit camping somewhat there. There are no fees for the campsites; camping must be in designated sites.

Glenn Haselfeld has done much hard work requiring countless hours extending the map area plus designing and setting all the courses.

Details For Thumb Butte Meet

Directions:

From Phoenix, take Interstate 17 and State Highway 69 to Prescott. Stay in the left lane as you approach the intersection with Highway 89. The road runs into Gurley Street and goes by Courthouse Square and Whiskey Row (Mile 0). Follow straight on the road (which turns into Thumb Butte Road). At 3.5 miles, you will pass through Thumb Butte Park and the road will turn to dirt. At mile 5.0, take a left onto Forest Road 373. Follow this road for 1.8 miles; it will cross a small creek (usually flowing) and climb up a hill. After the terrain levels, look for the orienteering sign near the intersection of FR 51. Parking will be along the side of FR 373 or FR 51. Please keep the roads clear so that cars can pass. Allow 2½ hours driving time from downtown Phoenix.

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Semi-Annual Land Navigation Class October 27 & 29

Master the use of topographic map and compass to travel through the wilderness with skill and confidence. This class is an evening in-town session then a full day in the field at a site near the town of Superior. It is designed for adults and is a very intensive, hands-on program. Read all about it in our brochure which can be found online at our website.

We provide dinner at the classroom session, plus breakfast, lunch, snacks and dinner at the field session. Students must provide their own transportation to and from the site. Students provide their own Silva Ranger 15 CL 360-degree compass. (Another model may be used if it has a baseplate, a mirrored lid with a site and a mechanical declination scale adjustment). A Silva compass may be rented for \$5. Cost is \$100. Members who have joined prior to July 1, 2005 get a \$20 discount. Class alumni, if it's been awhile since you've been practicing, you may take the class again for half price (\$50.00). Ask any of our previous students and they'll tell you what a great class it is.

Thumb Butte Course Setter's Notes

Daytime Score-O Event

This event is closer to a mini-ROGAINE than it is to one of our normal orienteering courses. Due to a lot of logging activity in the area, we have had to spread the course over a larger area to avoid areas with logging debris—and when you do that in mountainous terrain you get lots of elevation gain! Expect a really good workout... The terrain is forested with some areas of thick brush, and several areas have regions of large dispersed granite boulders. Elevations vary between 6000 and 7000 feet. Only a few rock clusters (groupings of rocks/boulders) and some distinct boulders have been mapped, usually near a current or previously used control point. Distinct boulders are usually 2-m high or larger in size.

The consensus of some of the vetters is that this course will be difficult to complete in 3 hours—so we are extending the time limit to **4 hours** (route planning time will be included in the 4 hours). There are about 45 controls spread across a 7 square kilometer area, so it should keep most busy for the full 4 hours. Easier controls (yellow or orange equivalent) are located near the start area for less experienced or less ambitious competitors. Start time is at 10 AM (although we may start folks earlier if we're ready). Last start time is 12 noon, and the course will close at 4 PM.

A few controls are located where a prescribed burn took place last fall. The good news is that it makes the terrain more open, and in some cases it offers a magnificent view of Granite Mountain to the north. Caution should be taken when traversing the steeper slopes. Some areas have thick pine needles, or in areas that have been burned, the ground is loose. In other places, the terrain is just plain rocky! Also, depending on route choice, you may cross over some active logging areas. Take caution in working across the debris.

Night-O

Given the long Score-O on Saturday morning, we decided to stick to two classic courses for the Night-O: a Yellow course and a Green course. The Yellow course is 2.7-km with 200-ft/60-m elevation gain. The Green course is 4.5 km with 500-ft/150-m elevation gain. We'll start at twilight (somewhere around 6:45 PM), and the course will close at 9:00 PM.

Most of the controls are unique to the Night course. Controls on the Yellow course will have the HIGHLY reflective markers hanging under each control. On the green course, we may use reflective tape that is not quite "lighthouse beacon grade", but will still be visible from 20-30 m away. Sunset on September 24: 6:23 PM and Moon on Sept. 24: Last quarter, moonrise at 10:54 PM.

Camping and control retrieval

Control retrieval is being deferred to Sunday morning. This will allow everyone to relax between the events on Saturday, and enjoy each other's company. Numerous campsites are available near the event start, and Prescott is only about 20 minutes away—so we hope you will make a weekend of it and stay Saturday night. We can really use some volunteers on Sunday to help retrieve the controls, since there are a LOT of them (60+) to pick up. We appreciate your help…
