March 4th at Lake Pleasant

Join us on Saturday, **March 4th** at a site just west of Lake Pleasant for the final meet of the season in the low desert. Develop your land navigation skills, compete for best time on one of five courses or just enjoy the great outdoors before the heat moves in and urban sprawl consumes this great example of the Sonoran Desert. Classic courses are being offered for all skill levels: White(beginner), Yellow(advanced beginner), Orange (intermediate), Green(advanced) and Red(advanced). Compete for best time or choose the recreational category if you do not wish to run competitively. This will be a joint event with the JROTC. This meet will also be for their regional championship, so expect to see some motivated kids!

People of all skill levels can participate and, of course, there will be a beginner's clinic. You may start anytime after the course opens. Everyone, including non-competitors, must be off the course by 1:00 when the course closes.

Directions to Lake Pleasant from Phoenix:

From Phoenix, take I-17 north to State Route 74/Carefree Highway – ext 223. Turn west (left) on to State Route 74 and proceed 13.2 miles. Turn right on an unnamed road .6 miles west of milepost 18. (It's 1.5 miles west of the Lake Pleasant visitor center turnoff.)

There is a prominent thumb butte on the south side of the highway at the turnoff. Look for orange/white Obags, signs or O-cones marking the turn from SR74 and at the meet site.

This is a joint event with JROTC, but we will have separate registration tables.

A whistle is required for all participants. Some are available to purchase for \$1. Compasses are available to rent for \$1. Your registration fee includes the map.

Spring Land Navigation Class - April 6 & 8, 2006

Master the use of topographic map and compass to travel through the wilderness with skill and confidence. This class is an evening in-town session then a full day in the field at a site near the town of Superior. This class is designed for adults and is a very intensive, hands-on program. Students walk four to five miles, with day packs, learning and practicing land navigation methods and techniques. We provide dinner at the classroom session, plus breakfast, lunch, snacks

and dinner at the field session. Students provide their own Silva Ranger 15 CL (or similar) 360-degree compass. A Silva compass may be rented for \$5.

Class alumni, if it's been awhile since you've been practicing, you may take the class again for half price (\$50.00). You can find an application inside the brochure posted on our website. Cost is \$100 (fully refundable until 3/31/2006). Members who have joined prior to Jan 1, 2006 get a \$20 discount.
