May 13-14: Lake-2-Lake Hike

We're planning something a bit different this year. This time we're going to be backpacking in on Saturday, starting NO LATER than noon, and camping overnight at a central location (maps to be provided to those interested). People can head out on their own or connect up with a group heading out from either Bear Canyon Lake or Knoll Lake (see directions).

Expect to go with a group unless you have good land nav skills. We should have leaders at both ends, and depending on the will of the crowd, we may exchange keys at the camp or we may have shuttle vehicles at one end waiting for us, or we might make the trip one way. We'll work that out when we figure out who's going.

Be sure to bring compass and whistle and count on carrying at least 6 quarts of water. We won't be able to verify that you have all the rest of what you need so be sure to ask if you're not sure. I'll have a comprehensive list available.

The hike is expected to be moderate to strenuous, for 5 to 7 miles round trip, so plan accordingly. Please RSVP to Richard Dewey at 480-236-5706, or email at richard.dewey@medtronic.com no later than May 1st.

Directions:

From Payson to Bear Canyon Lake, head East on Hwy 260 for approx. 29.5 miles and turn left at the Woods Canyon Lake turnoff, FR300.

Head West on FR300 for approx. 12.5 miles and turn right (North) on FR89.

Stay on FR89 for approx. 2.1 miles to the FR89A turnoff to Bear Canyon Lake.

We expect to be on the left before the junction. Look for the orange and white orienteering sign.

From Payson to Knoll Lake, head North on Hwy 87 from the Hwy 260 turnoff about 28.5 miles to the Rim Road turnoff (FR300).

Turn right on FR300 (gravel rd from here on – watch for a quick left turn about .1 miles in) and proceed for approx 22.6 miles to FR295E, turn left, proceed another 3.2 miles to a right turn (still FR295E) into the Knoll Lake area, go another 1.2 miles to the parking lot.

Note: all above mileages were extracted from the TOPO program and may have some error.
